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This Course orientation has been prepared to communicate the expectations, course content, course requirements, policies and any other information that will give you the opportunity to achieve and have a positive learning experience. Please read it carefully and share it with your parents. If you do not understand this course orientation sheet or have questions about this course, please see me personally.

- 1) <u>Introduction of Course-</u> This is a single semester course that will acquaint the student with art from around the world. Humanities is the study of art in many forms. This semester we will focus on English Literature from its beginnings through the Modern era. On our first block day each week, we will study the visual arts beginning in the Renaissance and moving through the beginnings of Modern art. On our second block day each week, we will study music going as far back as the Baroque period, and moving into the beginnings of Jazz. We will also spend time studying the influential filmmakers Alfred Hitchcock, and Steven Spielberg.
- 2) <u>Textbook and Other Materials-</u> There is no textbook for this class. I would like each student to have a section in their notebook that will be used specifically for this class. <u>I will collect your notes at the end of the semester for a notebook grade.</u>
- 3) <u>Grading System-</u> You will be evaluated on all assignments that I give you. All assignments will receive a numerical point value. Each student's grade will be determined by dividing the total number of points by the amount of points possible. The following scale will be used to determine the letter grade.

4) <u>Homework and Class Work-</u> **Assignments will only be accepted on the due date.** If you are absent on the day that an assignment is given, the assignment is due on the day after you come back. If you are absent on the due date, it is due the day you return to class. If your absence is not excused, you will not be able to make-up the assignment.

*In the beginning of the semester you will be given 5 opportunities to make up a homework assignment that you forgot to complete. The maximum point total that you can receive for a make-up assignment is 80%. For example, if it is a 40-point assignment, the most you can get is 32/40. However, 80% is better than a zero.

*Major projects and essays are due on the due date. Excused absences will not be accepted even in this case. I will however, accept the project or essay late with a penalty of a letter grade per day.

*Daily quizzes cannot be made-up; however, I drop the 4 lowest daily quiz scores at the 10-week report cart to make-up for any missed daily quizzes. There will also be extra credit assigned to make up for points missed.

There are a few other rules that all students need to follow in doing work:

- All work is to be done in ink. I am getting old and my eyesight is not what it once was. It is hard to read pencil with these old eyes, so please do your work in ink.
- All work is to be done on 8 ½ x 11-inch lined paper. Typing your assignments is even better.
- Please turn in work that is organized and neat. If I can't read your assignment, I can't grade your assignment.
- 5) <u>Academic Honesty:</u> A big part of being in school is to learn how to think critically and behave maturely, responsibly, and respectfully. Part of this learning process involves *academic honesty* when presenting your work to your instructor. Hence, *plagiarism* is **absolutely NOT tolerated under any circumstances**. Please note that all of our essays are submitted to Turnitin.com. This is a website that checks for plagiarism. Please turn in your own work and there will not be any issues. I will not give you credit for a plagiarized assignment.
- 6) <u>Classroom Management Policies-</u> I have very simple rules:
 - 1. You must show respect for your classmates at all times. I have a zero-tolerance level for any kind of disrespect by one student towards another. This includes foul language, sexual harassment, and any other kind of behavior that I feel is disrespectful. I want this to be a safe learning environment for all of my students.
 - 2. You must show respect for Mr. Fannon, as he will always respect you. All items under rule 1 apply
 - 3. Don't do anything stupid. Every student has been in school long enough to know what is stupid and what is not.
 - 4. No headphones at all in my class.
 - 5. No eating or drinking in class, unless it is water.

7) Cell Phone Policy and Rules-

I need you to be PRESENT every time we meet. To be present, there should be no distractions. Your cell phone can be a huge distraction if you let it. So that you will not become distracted, your cellphone will be put away in a pocket chart as you walk into class each day. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS. If you are caught using your cell phone during class because you did not put it in the pocket chart, I may take away your cell phone and contact your parent/guardian This policy also covers watches that allow you to access the Internet as well. Please see our school-wide electronic policy. I am trying to foster an engaged and thoughtful environment in our class. If you are distracted by your phone, you will not be engaged, and there will not be much thought put into our activities. Honestly it is a huge sign of disrespect and I would hope that you will respect the environment I am trying to create in my classroom.

8) <u>Tardies-</u> You are tardy if you are not in my class by the time the tardy bell rings. The school has a tardy policy that will be enforced in this class. Being on time to class is so important. It helps us to get started on time, it means less distractions for the class because there will not be students coming in while we are trying to learn. <u>Most importantly...</u>

If you are tardy you will not be allowed to take the Daily Quiz!!!
