Philip Glass


1937 - Present

Early life

- Born 1937 in Baltimore, Maryland
- Father owned a radio store
- Listened to western classical records
- Began learning flute & violin
- Enrolled early at University of Chicago to study mathematics and philosophy

Beginnings

- Became interested in atonal music
- Atonality- absence of a functional harmony
- Inspired to study composition at New York's Juilliard school.
- At 23, moved to paris to study under Nadia Boulanger
- Inspired by non-western music in India and Africa
- 1976, released Einstein on the Beach
- Returned to New York and formed the Philip Glass Ensemble
- Worked various jobs, including taxi driving, to support himself while creating music





Film and Operas

- Didn't like being called a minimalist
- First film Koyaanisqatsi (1982)
- Composed "The Voyage" for the Columbus quinquacentennial, commissioned by the Metropolitan Opera
- Composed for the Atlanta Olympic games
- "Portrait Operas" trilogy, focusing on historical figures

Music style

- Repetitive and hypnotic sounding
- Less focus on harmony, tempo, and melody
- Didn't see music having a beginning, middle, and end, he saw it as a process
- Composed Satyagraha, inspired by the structure of Indian music and used Sanskrit vocals
- Also his first major work that used the traditional orchestral lineup

Significance

- One of the first composers to start his own record label
- Creative use of repetition in compositions and operas
- Elevated minimalist style of composition
- Operas have been produced by some of the worlds greatest opera houses


